Apparitions of the Virgin Mary at CAMPIÑAS

BRAZIL, 1929

Sister Amalia Aguires was a pious nun who lived in Brazil. Together with the Most Reverend Francisco Von Campos Barreto, Bishop of the Diocese of Campiñas, she founded an Institute in Campiñas, Brazil. The convent was named "Institute of the Missionaries of Scourged Jesus". After she received the stigmata of Christ, Sister Amalia offered herself as a victim soul on behalf of sinners. On November 8, 1929, a relative of Sister Amalia approached her asking for help. His wife was terminally ill and their family was in a situation of great suffering. According to the physicians, the illness of his spouse was incurable. Not knowing what to do or what God expected from him, he turned to Sister Amalia, his last hope. Sister Amalia felt obligated to help him in whatever way possible and she turned to our Divine Savior. Sister Amalia entered the house of God and knelt in front of the altar, then she stretched her arms towards Jesus and asked: **"If there is no hope for the wife of T... I am ready to offer my life for a mother of a family. What do you want me to do?"** Sister Amalia: "If you wish to receive these favors, ask Me through the intercession of the Tears of My Mother," Sister Amalia then asked **"How must I pray?"** In response, Jesus pronounced the following invocations: "Oh Jesus, listen to our prayers through the Tears of your Most Blessed Mother, look at the tears of the one who loved you most on earth and with more fervor loves you in heaven." Then Jesus added: "My daughter, to all the people who will ask me graces praying the Tears of my Mother, I will grant them lovingly. Afterwards my Mother will leave a treasure to our beloved Institute to attract my Mercy." These events took place on November 8, 1929. Exactly four months later Jesus fulfilled the promise made to Sister Amalia. As foretold by the prophecy, the Blessed Virgin Mary gave a treasure from Heaven to the beloved Institute. The following passage is taken from the memories of Sister Amalia regarding what took place. It was March 8, 1930. I was in the chapel, kneeling near the altar, suddenly I was led to look up. At that moment I saw a woman of indescribable beauty who was approaching. She was wearing a purple tunic, a blue mantle and a white veil that came down around her shoulders. Smiling she remained suspended in the air turned towards me, holding a Rosary in her hands, that she herself called "Crown". Its beads above like the sun and were white as snow. Handing me the Rosary she said: "This is the Rosary of my Tears, which has been entrusted by my Son to this beloved Institute as a piece of inheritance. He has already revealed to you the invocations. He desires that I be honored in a special way with this prayer and He will grant any grace to those who will ask Him in the name of my Tears. This Rosary will serve to obtain the conversion of many sinners, especially those possessed by the devil. To the Institute of Scourged Jesus will be reserved the great honor of bringing back to the Holy Church and to the convert a great number of followers of this evil cult. The devil will be defeated with this Rosary and the power of Hell destroyed. Prepare yourself for this great battle!" When the Most Blessed Mother Mary finished speaking, she disappeared. Today we know all the events relating to the apparitions that Sister Amalia had at Campiñas thanks to the documentation that was found in Germany and that was collected in a booklet entitled "Our Dear Lady of Tears". The Bishop Francisco Von Campos Barreto ensured that thanks to the use of the medal of "Our Lady of Tears" countless conversions took place in Brazil and also in many other countries. "Countless Graces have been received through the prayer of the Rosary to honor in Brazil and also our dear Virgin Mary. The reason for these graces originates from the promise of the Holy Redeemer: "No grace shall be refused when it will be asked me in the name of the Tears of my Most Blessed Mother."

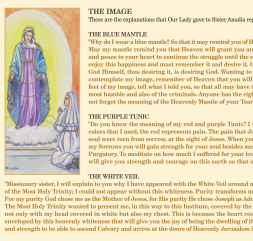

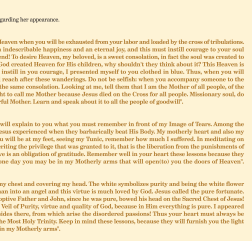

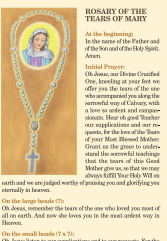
